

EOI for Submission of Project Proposals under (DDU-GKY 2.0), Rajasthan

The Rajasthan Skill and Livelihoods Development Corporation has invited applications from interested Project Implementation Agencies (PIAs) under the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana 2.0. for Financial year 2026-28. Eligible PIAs can submit their applications online through the official portal <https://kaushal.rural.gov.in/#/home>. Under category A, a total target of 12,381 is to be allocated and under Categories B, C, and D, a total target of 49,527 candidates is to be allocated. Additionally, PIAs are allowed to submit dedicated projects for rural youth under the Persons with Disabilities (PWD) category, which will be governed by the guidelines issued under Notification No. 43/2017. Each PIA is permitted to submit maximum three proposals.

National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj(NIRDPR) has been empanelled as Appraisal Agency under DDUGKY 2.0 in Rajasthan. Interested PIAs having PRN allotted from MoRD, may apply online on the portal of MoRD i.e. <https://kaushal.rural.gov.in/#/home> along with the non-refundable application fee of Rs 29,500 including GST (18%) for initial Screening. After clearing/Passing of the initial screening project applied agencies will be intimated by the designated Appraisal Agency to deposit Rs. 1,29,500 including GST (18%) for Quality Appraisal. The said fees shall be non-refundable under all circumstances including rejection, withdrawal or non-selection of the proposal.

The Appraisal of DDU-GKY 2.0 project will be conducted through the IT platform provided by MoRD only i.e. <https://kaushal.rural.gov.in/#/home> The account details for fee submission is (Name of Account NIRDPR DDUGKY, Account No- 62431332037, IFSC Code- SBIN0020965 Bank and Branch State Bank of India, NIRD Campus, Rajendranagar, Hyderabad – 500030, TELANGANA Applicant PIA should read the guidelines and Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) available on the website of MoRD (DDUGKY) carefully before filling up the application form.

1. The four categories of PIA under DDU-GKY 2.0: -

- A. Captive Employers.
- B. Existing PIAs having experience of greater than 50% placement with DDU-GKY.
- C. Skilling Agencies who do not have any DDU-GKY experience
- D. Start-ups for Skilling recognised by Dept. of Industrial Policy & Promotion, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, GoI.

2. In order to be eligible to apply for a project, an entity should be: -

- A. Registered under Indian Trust Acts or any State Society Registration Act or any State Cooperative Societies or Multi-State Co-operative Acts or the Companies Act 2013 or the Limited Liability Partnerships Act 2008, or SHGs and its federations namely Cluster Level Federation/Block Level Federations. OR
- B. A Government or semi-government organization at the State and National Level. OR
- C. NGOs must be registered with NITI Aayog's Darpan Portal. AND
- D. Be more than three years old at the time of application except Start-ups.

3. The following shall not be eligible for applying in DDU-GKY 2.0: -

- E. Existing PIAs who got DDU-GKY Projects sanctioned and have recovery proceedings going on.
- F. Existing PIAs who were unable to place 50% of trained candidates under DDU-GKY 1.0.



- G. Skilling agencies having officials at key managerial personnel as per accounting standard 18, who were earlier associated with defaulting PIAs against whom recovery proceedings were initiated due to default.
- H. Sister concern/subsidiary of any organization against whom default action for recovery of funds initiated.
- I. Skilling Agencies having Directors involved in agencies that defaulted earlier with DDU-GKY. A provision shall be built into the system for validating the DIN of directors of the applicant organization through MCA database.
- J. Skilling Agencies blacklisted by Government.
- K. No consortium shall be allowed.

4. The Appraisal of the proposal shall be carried out with the following conditions:

- A. All agencies (Existing DDUGKY 1.0 PIA and New agency) must have the new PRN generated through <https://kaushal.rural.gov.in/#/prn-registration> for DDUGKY 2.0 under Categories A, B, C, and D.
- B. Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs) are required to strictly follow the DDU-GKY Guidelines 2.0, Standard Operating Procedures (SOP), Notifications/Orders as notified by the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) and Rajasthan Skill and livelihoods development Corporation (RSLDC) from time to time. This includes any updates or modifications to the guidelines and procedures, as applicable and as amended from time to time.
- C. Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs) shall be required to furnish a Performance Security Deposit (PSD) of ₹5,00,000 (Rupees Five Lakh only) per SDC in the form of a Bank Guarantee (BG) at the time of signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). The PSD shall be refundable upon completion and final settlement of all batches, subject to fulfilment of all contractual obligations.
- D. The Project Implementing Agency (PIA) shall strictly ensure that the first batch is commenced on or before 31 October 2026. Additionally, no training activity, including On-the-Job Training (OJT), shall extend beyond 31 December 2027. The PIA must ensure that all targets are completed within the stipulated timeline.
- E. It is hereby directed that all Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs) must mandatorily verify the validity of the concerned trade on the Kaushal Rural Portal before opting/selecting any trade. In case any issue, discrepancy, or problem arises with respect to any trade, the entire responsibility shall lie with the concerned PIA. All PIAs are, therefore, instructed to ensure strict compliance with the above directions.
- F. The Project Implementing Agency (PIA) shall provide access to the IP cameras installed at the Skill Development Centre (SDC). RSLDC reserves the right to monitor activities through these IP cameras at any time. In case the PIA fails to provide access or changes the password without prior intimation to RSLDC, the PIA shall be liable for penalties, including any additional penalties as decided by the competent authority.
- G. RSLDC may conduct random physical verification of placements from the employer's end to ensure the authenticity of placements. Based on the findings of such verification, RSLDC reserves

the right to make payment deductions and impose minor or major penalties, as deemed appropriate.

H. PIAs applying under DDUGKY 2.0 shall have to comply with the sub category targets given in the table below:

- I. Under DDUGKY 2.0, clubbing of two or more Qualification Packs shall not be allowed to avoid duplication of NOS. However, based on the requirement of fulfilling a minimum of 576 hours, relevant independent NOS and micro-credentials shall be allowed to be added to meet out the minimum required duration of training (Ref. SoP DDUGKY 2.0 page no-446/C).
- J. DDUGKY 2.0 allows Training Course duration minimum of 3 months with 576 hrs. of Training (Domain 396 hrs. and non-Domain 180 hrs.). In cases where the no. of domain hours is less than 396 hrs., then relevant independent NOS/micro-credential of that sector shall be allowed to be added to meet out the minimum required training duration(Hours). If the duration of Domain hours is more than 396 hrs, Clubbing is not permitted (Ref. SoP DDUGKY 2.0 page no- 448/C).
- K. The core outcome of DDU-GKY program shall remain placement (minimum 70%) be it with Wage Employment (minimum 50%), Self-Employment (maximum 20%) or Gig Employment. Placement (Wage/self-employment& Gig employment) shall be considered based on the verifiable proof i.e. Bank Statement showing receipt of Monthly Salary through bank transfer in case of wage employment, Service Charges in case of Gig Employment and Income in case of Self Employment. Placement in self-employment shall be assisted through credit linkage by Banks. (Ref. Guideline 2.0 page no-35).
- L. Placement is to be made in the job roles for which domain training is provided. DDU-GKY shall be actively debarring cross placements in sectors where skill training acquired is not being used. However, if a candidate is placed in a sector that is different from the one in which they received training under the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY), the salary she/he receives should be at least 20% higher than the minimum wage of semi-skilled category or rupees 10,000/- per month, whichever is higher applicable at the employer's location, as notified by the relevant department. This provision ensures that the candidate is adequately compensated for their skills and experience, even when employed in a different sector than the one they were trained. (Ref. SoP DDUGKY 2.0 page no- 481).
- M. Minimum Remuneration per candidate per month within India of 10,000 or Minimum Wages of location of Employment of semiskilled category whichever is higher and Minimum Remuneration per candidate per month outside India is Rs. 25000 per candidate. (Ref. SoP DDUGKY 2.0 page no- 524).
- N. All applicants must comply with the Special Terms and Conditions specified in Annexure-F.

Note: The Project Approval Committee (PAC) of RSLDC shall have the final authority to make decisions regarding project approvals, based on budget availability, sector preferences, district coverage and number of candidates to be allocated. Districts to the PIAs shall be allocated by PAC taking into

consideration the per district capping as decided by the PAC. The decisions of the PAC shall be final and binding, and not subject to challenge.

Further, while allocation of targets, preferences/incentives may be given to the PIAs on the following grounds:

- i. Preference given by the PIA for district and trades pertaining to ODOP as per Annexure-A
- ii. Preference given by the PIA for preferential districts as per Annexure-B
- iii. Preference given by the PIA for aspirational blocks as per Annexure- C
- iv. Preference given by the PIA for courses pertaining to emerging sectors/ future skill courses as per Annexure-D.

Those who are interested may apply through the Kaushal Rural Portal (<https://kaushal.rural.gov.in/#/home>) within 21 calendar days from the date of publication of the EoI. Additionally, the Declaration (Annexure-E), along with all relevant supporting documents, must be submitted in hard copy within 5 days from the last date of EoI submission as per Kaushal Rural Portal.

Special Term and Conditions (Annexure-F): -

A. Responsibilities of SRLM/SSDM

The State Rural Livelihood Mission (SRLM)/State Skill Development Mission (SSDM) shall act as the nodal authority for the effective implementation, supervision, and monitoring of projects under DDU-GKY 2.0 in the State of Rajasthan. The SRLM/SSDM shall facilitate the Project Implementing Agency (PIA) through timely administrative support, guidance, and review mechanisms to ensure smooth execution of project activities. It shall ensure that funds are released to the PIA strictly in accordance with the approved financial norms, instalment schedules, and compliance requirements as prescribed under the DDU-GKY 2.0 Guidelines, Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), and notifications issued from time to time by the Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD).

Further, SRLM/SSDM shall undertake regular monitoring and evaluation of project performance through various mechanisms including desk appraisal, physical verification, field inspections, and quality assessments. It shall facilitate effective information exchange and dissemination, enabling analysis of project trends and performance indicators for better decision-making and continuous improvement. The SRLM/SSDM shall also conduct periodic MIS reviews and field visits to assess project outcomes and provide timely feedback for corrective measures wherever required.

Additionally, SRLM/SSDM shall endeavour to ensure, subject to availability of funds and approvals, timely release of funds based on performance milestones and compliance standards, and actively participate in meetings, discussions, and review sessions with the PIA and other stakeholders. It shall also undertake capacity-building initiatives such as training programs, workshops, and orientation sessions to strengthen the implementation capabilities of the PIA and enhance overall project efficiency.

B. Responsibilities of the Project Implementing Agency (PIA)

The Project Implementing Agency (PIA) shall bear full responsibility for the successful implementation of the project, including achievement of both physical and financial targets as approved under the Detailed Project Report (DPR). The PIA shall strictly comply with all provisions of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), Sanction Orders, annexures, and the applicable DDU-GKY 2.0 Guidelines, SOPs, and notifications issued by MoRD and SRLM/SSDM from time to time.

The PIA shall ensure adherence to high-quality standards across all stages of the project lifecycle, including mobilization, training delivery, assessment, certification, and placement. It shall proactively work towards continuous improvement in quality and outcomes. In case of any change in the organizational structure, legal status, or governance framework, the PIA shall promptly inform SRLM/SSDM in writing within a period of seven (7) days.

The PIA shall maintain complete and accurate records of all project-related activities and shall ensure timely uploading of all required data on the designated MIS/ERP platforms. These records shall be maintained until the project closure report is duly accepted and a closure certificate is issued by SRLM/SSDM. The PIA shall also ensure compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, including labour laws, safety standards, and fire safety requirements at training centres. It shall be solely responsible for all third-party engagements and liabilities arising out of project implementation.

C. Monitoring, Reporting, Audit, Inspection and Investigation

The PIA shall maintain comprehensive, accurate, and up-to-date records of all project-related activities, including but not limited to beneficiary enrolment, training delivery, attendance, assessments, certifications, placements, financial transactions, statutory compliance records, CCTV footage, and biometric attendance logs. All such records shall be retained for a minimum period of eight (8) years after project closure or for a longer duration if required under applicable laws or audit requirements.

The PIA shall ensure timely and accurate uploading of all data, reports, and supporting documents on

the MIS/ERP platforms specified by SRLM/SSDM and MoRD. It shall provide unrestricted access to all relevant information, including MIS credentials, CCTV recordings, biometric attendance logs, and financial records, whenever required by authorized officials, subject to applicable data protection and confidentiality requirements. The PIA shall also submit periodic progress reports, financial statements, placement records, and other documents within prescribed timelines.

SRLM/SSDM, MoRD, Technical Support Agencies (TSA), and other authorized bodies shall have the right to conduct inspections, audits, and investigations at any time during the project period or even after its completion within the record retention period. These may include technical, financial, operational, social, and forensic audits. The PIA shall fully cooperate with such inspections and provide complete access to premises, records, staff, and beneficiaries.

Any refusal to cooperate, delay in submission of information, obstruction, or tampering with records shall be treated as a material breach of the agreement and may result in strict actions including suspension of payments, recovery of funds, blacklisting, or termination of the project. SRLM/SSDM also reserves the right to appoint third-party agencies such as TSAs for monitoring and evaluation purposes.

D. Debarment of the PIA

In the event of non-performance or failure to meet the prescribed standards and obligations, SRLM/SSDM may initiate remedial actions against the PIA. If the PIA fails to take corrective measures within the stipulated time, the Project Sanctioning Authority may debar the PIA from participating in future projects. However, before any such action is taken, the PIA shall be given a reasonable opportunity to present its case and undertake necessary improvements.

E. Sub-contracting and Assignment

The PIA shall not assign, transfer, or subcontract any part of the project responsibilities to any third party without prior written approval from SRLM/SSDM. Any unauthorized subcontracting shall be treated as a violation of the agreement and may lead to termination of the project. Even in cases where subcontracting is approved, the PIA shall remain fully responsible for the performance and compliance of all project activities.

F. Penalty / Liquidated Damages for Non-Performance

In case of any breach of obligations, delay, misrepresentation, submission of false information, or failure to achieve the desired outcomes, SRLM/SSDM may impose penalties or liquidated damages up to ten percent (10%) of the total project cost based on severity of non-compliance and in accordance with applicable guidelines. Such penalties may be imposed per instance or per batch depending on the severity of the non-compliance. This shall be in addition to recovery of any excess funds released and shall not limit the authority of SRLM/SSDM to initiate further legal or administrative action including project termination or blacklisting.

G. Recovery of Dues

If any recovery of funds is ordered due to non-compliance or irregularities, the PIA shall be liable to refund the amount along with interest at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum. In case of failure to repay, recovery proceedings may be initiated under applicable laws such as the Public Money Recovery Act or the Revenue Recovery Act, 1890, without prejudice to any other legal remedies available to the authorities.

H. Suspension and Termination

SRLM/SSDM may suspend the project or withhold payments by issuing a written notice after giving reasonable opportunity of being heard, except in cases of urgency, non-performance, suspected fraud, insolvency, or directions from competent authorities. During the suspension period, the PIA shall comply with all instructions issued by SRLM/SSDM, including safeguarding of records and project assets.

The project may be terminated by SRLM/SSDM with a notice period of thirty (30) days in cases of insolvency, continued non-performance, misrepresentation, fraud, or statutory non-compliance. The PIA may also request termination by giving sixty (60) days' prior notice, subject to approval and completion of all obligations.

Upon termination, the PIA shall immediately cease all project activities and hand over all records, documents, and assets to SRLM/SSDM. It shall also refund any recoverable funds along with applicable interest. SRLM/SSDM reserves the right to adjust pending payments against recoverable amounts and initiate further legal action if required.

I. Amendment Clause

RSLDC reserves the right to amend, modify, or update these terms and conditions from time to time with prior notice and such amendments shall apply prospectively. Such amendments shall be binding upon the PIA.
